Dear Members:

Rather than recount the happenings of the past month as I usually do, instead I thought it would be nice to recount the beginnings of the modern Norway. For Norwegians, Syttende Mai (May 17th) is the celebration of their country's independence from a period of being a vassal state of Denmark. For those of us who are not steeped in Norwegian history, this seemed like a nice time to visit it.

For more than 400 years Norway was the weaker partner in a union with Denmark; exploited by autocratic Danish kings. Then in 1813 the Danish king, who had sided with Napoleon in the Napoleonic War of 1812, was forced to cede Norway to Sweden. The Norwegians were outraged at the thought of their country being given away like a piece of Danish property. With the help of an unlikely source, the heir to the Danish throne, a constitutional convention was called and Norway was established as a sovereign state. The constituent assembly met at Eidsvoll (Ides-vohl) in April–May, 1814. It was made up mostly of 112 active leaders in their thirties. Both conservatives and liberals, they were all nationalists and well-informed about the ideals born of the revolutions in France and America. The ideals in the constitutions of those countries inspired the New Norwegian document.

It took the assembly one month to prepare a constitution for Norway. The country was established as a sovereign state and a constitutional monarchy ruled by the principles of liberty and democracy. It was considered the most liberal constitution in Europe at that time.

The document was signed on May 17, Syttende Mai, 1814, and Norway finally had the fundamental law that carried the nation safely through all its times of crisis. The outcome of the swift Norwegian action early in 1814 was that Norway entered a union with Sweden in the fall of the same year—but not as a piece of land given away by the Danish king. Thanks to the constitution, Norway had now become a sovereign state and an equal partner in the union. When this union was dissolved in 1905, Norway was well on the way to being re-established on the European scene. The Constitution of 1814 is the foundation of the growth of a society which today has one of the highest standards of democracy and civility.

I would like to thank Trustee of the Month, David Trueb, for checking on the Lodge in the month of April.

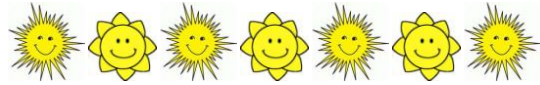

HISTORY OF NORWAY

This is a continuation of last month's installment which ended with the Viking era.

Up to the ninth century, regions were structured around two main types of communities. They were: Assemblies or "Tings" organized around a central common area known as an "Alting" and small, localized kingdoms known as petty kingships.

Tings were established by farmers as security from marauders. The tings were usually in the coastal areas, where they were preyed upon by robber bands and returning Vikings. The petty kingships were more urbanized and trafficked in stolen and traded goods, thus gaining wealth and power. This was particularly true in the Viken, the areas surrounding the Oslofjord. Their power increased steadily as district after district was consolidated under a small number of rulers. After a battle fought in the year 872 near Stavanger, King Harald Fairhair strengthened his position as ruler of the largest area of the country. This unifying process continued for several more decades, bringing harsh struggles between warring Norwegian chieftains. However, by 1060 the unifying process appeared to have been completed.

The advent of Christianity

Christianity was introduced into Norway over a lengthy period of time, possibly two hundred years. It was a natural result of the Norwegians' contact with Christian Europe, through trading connections and Viking raids. Missions from the churches of England, Germany and Denmark had also contributed to a weakening of traditional belief in the Nordic gods. This development culminated with the three missionary kings, Håkon the Good, Olaf Trygvasson, and Olaf the Stout. The latter's death, at the battle of Stiklestad in 1030, gave him saint's status. The Church had won the final victory.

By the middle of the 11th century the laws that were enacted, the songs that were sung, and the monuments that were erected demonstrated the firm establishment of Christianity in Norway. Shortly before the year 1100 the first bishoprics appeared. Trondheim was where the archbishop held office starting in 1152.

The Norwegian archbishop also played a political role. In 1537 the Reformation was enforced in Norway by royal decree. At this time the country was under Danish rule, and the Reformation was enforced simply by making the so-called Danish/Norwegian church ordinance applicable in Norway as well.
